


Remote Work Survey Results

The Nebraska Association of Public Employees received over 1,700 responses to our survey regarding remote work.

Respondent Demographics:



1,404 work remotely in some capacity and 186 have done so so prior to March 2020.

The majority of survey respondents are veteran state employees.

1,157 have been in state service since at least 2020 (66.8%)

have been in state service for more than a decade

have been in state service for more than two decades

possess over three decades of institutional knowledge and experience

This data shows that our state agencies are at risk of losing employees with years of Institutional knowledge.

As a direct result of the Executive Order:

797 State Employees are considering looking for a new employer.

593 activel already already

State Employees are actively looking, have already applied, or have already accepted a job with a new employer.

In other words, we may lose as many as **1,390** public servants as a result of the EO. That equates to approximately **16% of our NAPE/AFSCME workforce.**

If the EO was rescinded

say they would stay with the State of Nebraska

As a direct result of the Executive Order, we are poised to lose:

More than

employees who work in Child & Family Services protecting vulnerable youth of Nebraska.

This equates to a loss of at least 10% of the workforce.

More than

employees who work to provide services to Nebraskans with disabilities

This equates to a loss of at least 33% workforce.

More than

employees who provide social services to Nebraskans in need

This equates to a loss of at least 25% of the workforce.

More than

60 employees who keep Nebrsakans safe as engineers and scientists

This equates to a loss of at least 20% of the workforce.

More than

employees who assist
Nebraskans in finding
gainful employment

This equates to a loss of at least 16% of the workforce.
